### **Identifying Poison Ivy And Poison Oak In The Spring**

Once the temperature warms up in your part of the country, the poison ivy and poison oak plants' leaves will begin to emerge from their buds. The immature leaves start out with a red, waxy appearance. As the leaves grow they turn green. Below are some pictures to help you identify these plants.
